

Key Findings


Homelessness in Arizona

The 2023 Point in Time (PIT) count, which provides a snapshot of the population experiencing homelessness in the region, counted 14,237 people experiencing homelessness on January 23, 2023, in Arizona. 9,642 of those individuals were living within Maricopa County, representing 68% of the state's total.



Revenue Streams: Homelessness Assistance Programs

The homelessness ecosystem consists of a complex array of organizations, agencies, and funding streams. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is the key federal agency working on this issue, while states and localities have many different agencies and departments working on preventing and resolving homelessness.

on the type of count used. In comparison, spending per pupil for K-12 education in Arizona Public Schools is around \$14,673.



Workforce Serving People Experiencing Homelessness

In Arizona, it is estimated that 9,000 employees work in organizations or other entities that have services or housing dedicated to people experiencing homelessness. The estimated number of volunteers is 42,000 people putting in around 2.1 million hours. The estimated financial value of volunteer hours is \$66.9 million.






Mortality Rates Among People Experiencing Homelessness

The increasing unsheltered population estimates have coincided with other negative social outcomes associated with the pandemic and recent policy actions. Crime and drug abuse and overdose are rising both nationally and in Arizona. The rate of deaths among individuals experiencing homelessness is increasing at a faster pace in Arizona than the

rate of homelessness itself. Based on Medical Examiner data, CSI estimates that 81% of deaths in people experiencing homelessness were drug-related, versus approximately 21% of overall deaths.
